



Parent and child friendly Safeguarding Policy

This 'child friendly' policy is designed for young people and this should be read as a guide to the Turning Heads main policy.

This policy is to help you decide what could be a 'problem' and where to get help and support.

Is someone bullying you?

You must tell someone at Turning Heads so we can help you.

Examples of people you can tell at Turning Heads are:

- Alan, June or Nicola
- Staff from The Windmill Centre

Do NOT keep it problems a Secret! You must tell someone so we can help you.

Do NOT keep it things a secret! Has someone asked you if you want a tablet or to smoke a cigarette, or have a drink of something and you do not know what it is?

Do not eat, drink or smoke what they are giving you. You must tell someone at Turning Heads so we can help you.

Has someone hit, punched or smacked you?

There are many staff for you to talk to and they will help support you.

Talk to someone.

Sometimes a member of staff at Turning Heads will need to check things then if they can deal with the issue themselves, they will. There are times though when they may need to contact some other agencies for support. These may be Children's Social Care (Social Workers) or Police. There are lots of other agencies who support children and their families as well.

Appointed Person

An appointed person should be made known to members, volunteers and parents alike; as the designated person to whom concerns should be addressed. If the concern is about this designated person, please report to **Alan Tilley, Turning Heads**.
